Committee Reports:


Rear Commodore: Mark West

She brought information about the World Central Kitchen spearheaded by Chef Jose Andres as a charity which is reputable and provides immediate food to those in need.

Karl Mielenhausen stated that two other organizations that will be helping with hurricane relief are the Ocracoke Foundation and the Outer Banks Foundation. Kathie King pointed out that NC Baptists on Mission is a wonderful charity and will be working in Ocracoke. Members are encouraged to give to any or all charities.
